The General Fund will face increasing expenditures for the remainder of this decade due to increasing contributions to pensions. These increases will be ongoing after they are fully implemented. The multivear budgets reflect these increased costs, but in the years beyond those increases will continue. Cost of

Living Adjustments will not be enough to cover typical step and column increases and the increased pension contributions. In an effort to prepare for the additional expenditures the Board should consider committing funds for the additional expenditures needed to meet pension obligations.

9.12. Classified Salary Schedule (Supplement)
On July 1st 2015, the District and CSEA entered into an agreement that "should the District increase the total compensation for the SWTA bargaining unit for the 2015-2016 school year above and beyond restoration, the District agrees to increase total compensation by the same percentage for the CSEA bargaining unit above and beyond restoration. The parties agree[d] to meet and negotiate on the form of such increased compensation."
On March 30, 2016 the District and SWTA agreed to increase SWTA's salary for 2015-16 beyond restoration by an extension of the salary schedule equivalent to 0.83% of the unit's salary cost and a one-time flat payment per unit member equivalent to 1.25% of the unit's salary cost. CSEA has agreed to accept the equivalent percentage increases in the form of a 0.83% salary increase to classified salary schedule 3 and 8 as well as a one-time flat payment of \$308 per unit member, which is equivalent to 1.25% of the unit's salary cost.
The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Trustees approve the attached 2015-2016 classified salary schedule 3 and 8 which include a 0.83% increase and a one-time bonus of \$308 per CSEA member.
