**10.3** Resolution 16-17-15 Increase of School Facility Developer Fees for Residential, Commercial and Industrial Development, Under California Government Code §65995 and California Education Code §17620

Government Code (G.C.) §65995(b)(3) provides for a biennial adjustment to the maximum statutory school facility developer fees that can be imposed by school districts on new development. The adjustment is an amount equal to the change in construction costs (based on the RS Means Class B Construction Cost Index) as determined by the State Allocation Board (SAB). On February 24, 2016, the SAB took action to adjust fees for new residential and commercial/industrial construction. School districts are authorized to levy up to \$3.48 per square foot on new residential construction and \$0.56 per square foot on new commercial/industrial construction, if the district has justified that its costs for providing school facilities to accommodate growth from development are shown to equal or exceed these levels.

Eric Hall and Associates has prepared a 2016 Developer Fee Justification Study (DFJS). The 2016 DFJS justifies the District to collect the maximum statutory residential level fees (sometimes called "Level 1" fees) of \$3.48 pursuant to current statute, for residential development. The District is also justified in collecting the current maximum statutory level commercial/industrial fee of \$0.56 for all categories except for rental self-storage which is justified at a lower rate of \$0.02; industrial parks/warehousing which is justified at a lower rate of \$0.49; and hospitality/lodging which is justified at a lower rate of \$0.41. A copy of the 2016 DFJS is on file and available for public review in the Business Office. Under the fee-sharing agreement with Whittier Union High School District, SWSD is entitled to two-thirds of the justified fee.

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This equates to \$2.32 per sq. ft. for residential development and \$0.37 per sq. ft. for commercial/industrial development, except for rental self-storage which is justified at a lower rate of \$0.02; industrial parks/warehousing which is justified at a lower rate of \$0.49; and hospitality/lodging which is justified at a lower rate of \$0.41.

As required by law a Public Hearing must be held prior to considering the fee increases. A 10-day notice period is required. The Public Notice was published in the Whittier Daily News newspaper on September 6, 2016 and September 13, 2016.

In order to update the justification for the collection and levy of developer fees, the Board's approval of the continuation of collecting fees at the statutory developer fee rate as justified in the 2016 DFJS prepared by Eric Hall & Associates is required. The Board's adoption of Resolution 16-17-15 would authorize the Superintendent or designee to sign all necessary documents on behalf of the District. The increased fee levels will take effect 60 days after approval, on November 12, 2016.

### **Executive Summary:**

At the end of each fiscal year, the books of the District are closed. Closing the books is the recordkeeping process where revenues and expenditures are adjusted to reflect final balances for the fiscal year. The Unaudited Actuals financial reports are then prepared in a format required by the California Department of Education. Education Code 42100(a), requires school districts to adopt the Unaudited Actuals by September of each year.

#### **Financial Condition:**

The district's accounting records for fiscal year 2015-16 were closed in August 2016. The General Fund is the largest and most important operating fund of the district. The Unrestricted General Fund is used for general education expenses such as classroom teacher salaries while the Restricted General Fund is used for specific state, federal, and local programs.

The district has a positive financial status at the end of 2015-16. The District met the minimum Reserve for Economic Uncertainties of 3% of expenditures and other uses.

The general fund had an unrestricted ending balance of \$4,314,144.07 a restricted ending balance of \$1,695,950.28 for a combined ending balance of \$6,010,094.35

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#### **10.6** Resolution #16-17-013 - GANN Limit

The Gann Limit is intended to constrain the growth in state and local government spending by limiting year-over-year changes in expenditures to changes in inflation (represented by per capita personal income) and caseloads (represented by average daily attendance [ADA] for schools). It is important to understand that not all revenue sources count against the district's Gann Limit. The Gann Limit only constrains the appropriations from state and local tax sources, so federal aid is excluded, as well as non-tax income, such as revenues from cafeteria sales, adult education fees, and foundations.

Education Code Section 42132 specifies that school district governing boards shall adopt a resolution by September 15 each year identifying the estimated appropriations limit for the current year and the actual appropriations limit for the preceding year. Documentation supporting the adopted resolution shall be made available to the public.

The attached resolution and Gann Form show that the district's limit for 2015-16 was \$16,300,567.76 and the estimated limit for 2016-17 is \$16,540,399.64

The District was in compliance with the appropriations limit for 2015-16 and the budgeted expenditures for 2016-17 are within the GANN limits. Financial Impact: There is no fiscal impact on the General Fund.
